Height of *k*-coloured and *k*-generalised Motzkin paths

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SOUTH AFRICA

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Parameter: TOTAL HEIGHT OF ALL THE PATHS of length n.













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Let $\phi_j(y)$ be the generating function for paths with height $\leq m$, ending at (n, j), where y counts the unit steps.

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$$\begin{split} \phi_0(y) &= 1 + yk\phi_0(y) + y\phi_1(y) & \text{for } j = 0 \\ \phi_j(y) &= y\phi_{j-1}(y) + ky\phi_j(y) + y\phi_{j+1}(y) & \text{for } 0 < j < m \\ \phi_m(y) &= ky\phi_m(y) + y\phi_{m-1}(y) & \text{for } j = m. \end{split}$$

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$$1 \xrightarrow{y} 0 \xrightarrow{ky} 0$$

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Recurrences in a matrix

Let $\phi_j(y) := \phi_j$, for paths ending at (n, j). The m + 1 equations can be represented in a matrix:

$$\begin{pmatrix} 1-ky & -y & 0 & \cdots & 0 \\ -y & 1-ky & -y & & & \\ 0 & -y & 1-ky & & & \\ \vdots & & \ddots & & \vdots \\ & & & 1-ky & -y & 0 \\ 0 & & \cdots & 0 & -y & 1-ky \end{pmatrix} \begin{pmatrix} \phi_0 \\ \phi_1 \\ \phi_2 \\ \vdots \\ \phi_{m-2} \\ \phi_{m-1} \\ \phi_m \end{pmatrix} = \begin{pmatrix} 1 \\ 0 \\ 0 \\ \vdots \\ 0 \\ 0 \\ 0 \\ 0 \end{pmatrix}$$

/1)

Since the Motzkin paths end on the x-axis, j = 0, we are interested in $\phi_0(y)$.

$\phi_0(y) := A_{\leq m}(y)$

We rename $\phi_0(y)$ with $A_{\leq m}(y)$, the generating function for all Motzkin paths of length n, ending at (n, 0), with height at most m, and with horizontal steps coloured with k colours.

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Then, $[y^n]A_{\leq m}(y)$ is the number of such paths of length *n*. Using Cramer's rule, we have

$$\phi_0(y) = 2 \frac{\left(1 - ky + \sqrt{X}\right)^{m+1} - \left(1 - ky - \sqrt{X}\right)^{m+1}}{\left(1 - ky + \sqrt{X}\right)^{m+2} - \left(1 - ky - \sqrt{X}\right)^{m+2}}$$

where

$$X = 1 - 2ky - 4y^2 + k^2y^2.$$

After the substitution $y = \frac{v}{1+kv+v^2}$, we have a simpler expression:

$$A_{\leq m}(y)$$
, $A_{\infty}(y)$ and $A_{>m}(y)$

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$$A_{\leq m}(y) = \frac{(1+kv+v^2)(1-v^{2m+2})}{1-v^{2m+4}}.$$

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Assuming |v|<1, letting $m\to\infty,$ we have the g.f. for ALL k-coloured Motzkin paths



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Assuming |v| < 1, letting $m \to \infty$, we have the g.f. for ALL k-coloured Motzkin paths



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Total height

Thus the generating function for the TOTAL HEIGHT is:

$$E(y)$$

$$\sum_{m=0}^{\infty} A_{>m}(y)$$

$$= \sum_{m=0}^{\infty} \frac{(1+kv+v^2)v^{2m+2}(1-v^2)}{1-v^{2m+4}}$$

$$= (1+kv+v^2)\frac{1-v^2}{v^2}\sum_{n\geq 1} (d(n)-1)v^{2n}.$$

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Series expansion for k = 2 is

$$y^{2} + \frac{6y^{3}}{10} + 27y^{4} + 110y^{5} + 430y^{6} + 1652y^{7} + 6306y^{8} + \cdots$$

Aim: To find an asymptotic expression for $[y^n]E(y)$, the total height for paths of length n as $n \to \infty$. We analyse the variable by means of an integral representation together with residue calculus and contour integration:

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Mellin transform

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Inverse Mellin transform

$$f(t) = \frac{1}{2\pi i} \int_{c-i\infty}^{c+i\infty} t^{-s} f^*(s) ds,$$

where *c* lies in the vertical strip of convergence of $f^*(s)$.

Asymptotics - $v = e^{-t}$

With the use of the substitution $v = e^{-t}$

$$E(y) = (1 + kv + v^2) \frac{1 - v^2}{v^2} \sum_{n \ge 1} (d(n) - 1) v^{2n}$$

= $\underbrace{(1 + ke^{-t} + e^{-2t})(1 - e^{-2t})e^{2t}}_{A(t)} \underbrace{\sum_{n \ge 1} (d(n) - 1)e^{-2nt}}_{B(t)}$

where

$$B^*(s) = \sum_{n \ge 1} (d(n) - 1)(2n)^{-s} \Gamma(s) = \zeta(s)(\zeta(s) - 1)2^{-s} \Gamma(s).$$

After applying the Inverse Mellin transform, and expanding around the dominant singularities, we have

$$E(y) \sim -2 \ln 2 - k \ln 2 - 2 \ln t - k \ln t - 2 + 2\gamma - k + \gamma k + \frac{t}{2} (6 + 3k) + \frac{t^2}{36} (-74 + 48\gamma - 19k + 6\gamma k - 48 \ln 2 - 6k \ln 2 - 48 \ln t - 6k \ln t) + \frac{t^3}{4} (8 + k).$$

After substituting t as a function of y, finding the coefficient of y^n and dividing by the total number of Motzkin paths of size n, we have

Theorem 1:

The average total height of Motzkin paths with horizontal steps with $k \ge 1$ colours is as $n \to \infty$

$$e_k(n)\sim rac{\sqrt{n\pi}}{\sqrt{k+2}}-rac{3}{2}+rac{(k+44)\sqrt{\pi}}{48\sqrt{k+2}\sqrt{n}}.$$

Let $\phi_{j,k}(y)$ be the generating function that counts the paths with height $\leq m$ and ending at the point (n,j). We want $\phi_{0,k}(y)$.

$$\begin{split} \phi_{0,k}(y) &= 1 + y^k \phi_{0,k}(y) + y \phi_{1,k}(y) & \text{for } j = 0 \\ \phi_{j,k}(y) &= y \phi_{j-1,k}(y) + y^k \phi_{j,k}(y) + y \phi_{j+1,k}(y) & \text{for } 0 < j < m \\ \phi_{m,k}(y) &= y^k \phi_{m,k}(y) + y \phi_{m-1,k}(y) & \text{for } j = m. \end{split}$$

The m + 1 equations in a matrix form

Again, we put the m + 1 equations in a matrix form. The square matrix is:

Determinant

The determinant $a_{m,k}(y)$ of that square matrix is

$$a_{m,k}(y) = rac{\left(rac{1-y^k+\sqrt{X}}{2}
ight)^{m+2} - \left(rac{1-y^k-\sqrt{X}}{2}
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where

$$X = 1 - 2y^k - 4y^2 + y^{2k}.$$

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where

$$X = 1 - 2y^k - 4y^2 + y^{2k}.$$

With Cramer's rule and the substitution $y^k = \frac{v - y - yv^2}{v}$, we get

$$\phi_{0,k}(y) = A_{\leq m,k}(y) = \frac{v(1-v^{2m+2})}{y(1-v^{2m+4})},$$

which as $m \to \infty$ gives $A_{\infty,k}(y) = \frac{v}{y}$.

After performing $A_{\infty,k}(y) - A_{\leq m,k}(y)$ to get $A_{>m,k}(y)$ we have

$$E(y) = \sum_{m \ge 0} A_{>m,k}(y) = \frac{v(1-v^2)}{y} \sum_{m \ge 1} (d(n)-1)v^{2n}.$$

All Motzkin k-generalised paths

Using the first return decomposition:



This translates to

$$M(y) = 1 + y^{k}M(y) + y^{2}M(y)^{2},$$

or

$$M(y) = \frac{1 - y^k - \sqrt{(1 - y^k)^2 - 4y^2}}{2y^2} = \frac{v}{y}.$$

To get asymptotics for the total height, we use singularity analysis and expand around the dominant singularity ρ , the root of $(1 - y^k)^2 - 4y^2 = 0$. For k odd,

Theorem 2: Asymptotics for number of generalised paths

$$M_k(n) \sim \rho^{-n} \left[\frac{\sqrt{\rho(8\rho + 4k\rho^k)}}{4\sqrt{\pi}\rho^2 n^{3/2}} + \frac{3P}{64\sqrt{\pi}\rho^4 \sqrt{\rho(8\rho + 4k\rho^k)} n^{5/2}} \right]$$

where P is

$$\begin{split} & 14\rho^3(-8\rho-4k\rho^k) \\ & + 4\rho^3(\rho(-8\rho-4k\rho^k)^2-\rho(8+4(1-k)k\rho^{-1+k}+2k^2\rho^{-2+2k})). \end{split}$$

Asymptotics: Total height of k-generalised paths, k odd

Applying the Mellin transform, with the substitution $v = e^{-t}$:

Theorem 3: Asymptotics for Total height

$$T_k(n) := \rho^{-(n+1)} \left[\frac{1}{2n} - \frac{3\sqrt{2+k\rho^{-1+k}}}{4\sqrt{\pi}n^{3/2}} - \frac{4\rho - k\rho^k}{12\rho n^2} \right].$$

Dividing $T_k(n)$ by $M_k(n)$:

Theorem 4: Mean height, k odd
