Theorem (Knuth, 1973)

$$Sort(S) = Av(231)$$

    for  $i$  from 1 to  $|\sigma| - 1$ 
        if  $\sigma_i > \sigma_{i+1}$ 
            swap( $\sigma_i, \sigma_{i+1}$ )
        end
    end
until  $\sigma$  is sorted
```

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Sketch of the proof

Introduce the *local sorting operators*

$$\begin{array}{ccc} M_1 u_1 \cdots M_i u_i \cdots M_k u_k & \xrightarrow{B_{M_i}} & M_1 u_1 \cdots u_i M_i \cdots M_k u_k \\ v_h m_h \cdots v_j m_j \cdots v_1 m_1 & \xrightarrow{\tilde{B}_{m_j}} & v_h m_h \cdots m_j v_j \cdots v_1 m_1 \end{array}$$

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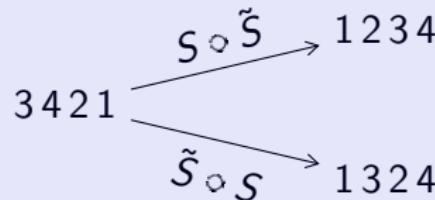
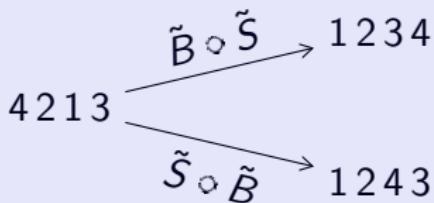
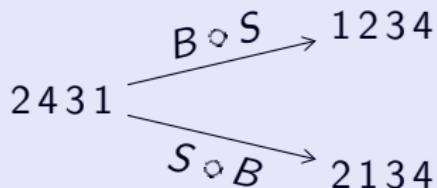

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Permutations sorted by A

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Inflation of σ by $\alpha_1, \alpha_2, \dots, \alpha_n$

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- p_i order-isomorphic to α_i , $\forall i$
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$$3 \ 1 \ 2 [21, 213, \textcolor{red}{132}] = \quad 2 \ 1 \ 3$$
